 2 patients were completely cured



Strengthening environmental education at the school


- Zero food waste, reducing use of plastic products

Medical Volunteers

 Medical volunteers in the Jungto Society started working in Philippines as the first international project



Emergency relief

- Typhoon Mangkhut hit northern Philipinnes in September, causing fourth biggest property loss and damage
- Provided cookware, plates, mats, and mosquito nets to 465 households (2800 people)
- Provided school supplies to 110 students





Bangladesh Project

- About one million Rohingya people live in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh–Myanmar border. Seventy percent of them escaped from the Rohingya genocide in August 2017.
- We provided 100,000 gas burners to the Rohinya people in collaboration with the World Food Program (WFP). This helped women and children who went far to find firewood.

Emergency Relief



To 16 villages in Palu and Donggala

- 50 volunteers participated locally
- Provided 75 tons of rice to 3000 households (25kg per household)
- Provided 1000 tents and 3000 blankets
- Provided 3000 sets of cookware (16 kinds)
- Provided 3200 t-shirts


T-shirts included supporting messages, "PALU KUAT" and "PALU BANGKIT", which mean "Hang in there Palu" and "Rise up Palu" in Indonesian.





Supporting for construction

 Provided 40 temporary houses in the town of Buddhists in Lombok.



Indonesia Project

- A deadly earthquake struck Indonesia's Lombok island in August 2018 and after a month, a massive earthquake hit the Sulawesi province. As a tsunami followed, many people lost their property, and tremendous number of houses and buildings were damaged or destroyed.
- We provided emergency relief in Indonesia through supporting building houses in Lombok and providing supplies in Palu.
